Since its foundation in 1981 the Herschel Museum has built up its collection and made many improvements to the building, visitor facilities and garden of the house. We pride ourselves on maintaining a standard of excellence while continually expanding our programme of education and outreach, offering ongoing temporary exhibitions and improving the service we offer all our visitors.

Although the Herschel Museum continues to thrive on many levels, it remains totally independent, receiving no core funding or external support, thus relying heavily on income generated by admissions and sales in the shop. This source of income alone is not sufficient to cover the daily overheads and running costs of the museum, while its endowment has decreased in value over the years since the Hilliards put it in place.
